1160	King Henry II allowed monks in Hull to begin fishing.	
1778	'Junction Dock' in Hull was opened. It was the largest dock in Britain at the time.	
1854	Hull's trawler industry began.	
1854	Queen Victoria and Prince Albert visited the docks in Hull.	
1885	Hull's first steam trawler 'Magenta' was launched.	
1968	Three trawlers from Hull all sank.	
1968	Lillian Bilocca started her campaign to improve the safety of fishing.	
1978	St Andrew's Dock closed and the trawlers moved to the Albert and William Wright docks.

	She was a lady who improved safety in the
	fishing industry. She was the leader of the
	'headscarf revolutionaries'.
	<b>Grace Darling</b> (1815-1852)
	She was a lighthouse keeper's daughter who
	saved 9 men when their ship sank in 1838.

Trawler	A boat used for catching fish in a large net.
Heritage	A building or tradition that was created in the past.
Dock	An area of water in a port for the loading, unloading, and repair of ships.
Industry	The processing of raw materials and manufacture of goods in factories.
<b>Bathing Machine</b>	A wheeled hut pulled to the edge of the sea, used for changing in.
Habitats	A natural home or environment of an animal or plant.
Tide	The rising and falling of the sea created by the moon's pull.
