64 MODERATED DATA

It was agreed that going forward, ERP children are to be included in all data as standard and KM would add context if required. The figures below include all ERP children

Year 1 Phonics - cohort of 43

- The cohort consists of 21 boys and 22 girls including 2 SEN & 11 DA
- 86% passed the statutory tests (national average 2019 82%)
- Girls performed better than boys

C: (DS) The Phonics is consistent throughout, well done KM: We will also be teaching phonics in Year 3 from next year

Year 2 Phonics retakes - cohort of 5

- The cohort consist of 4 girls and 1 boy
- 1 pupil successful (girl)

Year 2 SATs - cohort of 38

- Early predictions indicate CPS will be above national but this will be confirmed at a later date
- Reading 71% EXS, 21% GD
- Writing 63% EXS, 18% GD
- Maths 74% EXS, 18% GD

Q: (JC) The gender gap in Year 2 seems huge? The girls seem to be lacking

KM: There are a couple in the year group who are not as fluent at reading as the boys and in small groups, one or two pupils can affect the data greatly

C: (EM) As a parent, I can attest to the great support given to the lower achieving pupils. I also think boys respond to electronic learning better than girls, that could be having an effect

Q: (JC) Do the use of tablets impact negatively on handwriting?

KM: Handwriting does not matter as much as it used to. Examiners look at the content and consistency is key

Q: (DS) How much does autocorrect help?

KM: It is switched off!

Year 4 Multiplication

NB: There is no pass mark

- A huge improvement has been seen this year. The competitiveness the pupils show encourages them to beat their previous scores
- 50% of students achieved full marks (25)
- 69% achieved 24/25
- 94% achieved 20+

Q: (JC) With the exception of reading, all are below average. How does this compare to last year? I understand Covid has had an impact

KM: We can't compare to last year as the 2 cohorts are completely different due to the high number of SEN and DA children in this year group and the number with an EHCP. We have managed to catch-up with the curriculum but there wasn't sufficient time for consolidation. It's no excuse but is a valid reason

- C: (LL) Attendance has also been impacted by anxiety and we had a number of children allocated 25% extra time
- C: (KM) We have looked at comparisons with the other MAT primaries and we need to work on reading in KS2. The process has started so we will be ready in September. We also need to do more class work in Maths as a lot of that is now online
- Q: (JC) What do you think is the reason for the drop from term 2 to term 3 in year 5? KM: They do an actual written SATs assessment in term 3 which accurately informs
- C: (LL) It's also important to note we are not quick to make judgements, we give them the full year to show progress

C: (DS) Year 5 seem weak

LL: They were also impacted greatly by the pandemic and a lot of the mobile children are taking longer to settle. We are seeing small groups of borderline children and I am in with them each morning carrying out interventions.
