### Timeline

<b>1160</b>	King Henry II allowed monks in Hull to begin fishing.	
<b>1778</b>	'Junction <b>Dock</b> ' in Hull was opened. It was the largest <b>dock</b> in Britain at the time.	
<b>1854</b>	Hull's trawler <b>industry</b> began.	
<b>1854</b>	Queen Victoria and Prince Albert visited the <b>docks</b> in Hull.	
<b>1885</b>	Hull's first steam <b>trawler</b> 'Magenta' was launched.	
<b>1968</b>	Three <b>trawlers</b> from Hull all sank.	
<b>1968</b>	Lillian Bilocca started her campaign to improve the safety of fishing.	
<b>1978</b>	St Andrew's <b>Dock</b> closed and the <b>trawlers</b> moved to the Albert and William Wright docks.	

### Key People

	<b>Lillian Bilocca (1929-1988)</b> She was a lady who improved safety in the fishing industry. She was the leader of the 'headscarf revolutionaries'.
	<b>Grace Darling (1815-1852)</b> She was a lighthouse keeper's daughter who saved 9 men when their ship sank in 1838.

<b>Bathing machine</b>	A wheeled hut pulled to the edge of the sea, used for changing in.
<b>dock</b>	An area of water in a port for the loading, unloading, and repair of ships.
<b>Fishing</b>	Catching fish for food or as a sport.
<b>heritage</b>	A building or tradition that was created in the past.
<b>habitats</b>	A natural home or environment of an animal or plant.
<b>industry</b>	The processing of raw materials and manufacture of goods in factories.
<b>mechanism</b>	Parts working together in a machine
<b>tide</b>	The rising and falling of the sea created by the moon's pull.
<b>trawler</b>	A boat used for catching fish in a large net.
