


Enjoy reading a book by Roald Dahl, David Walliams, J.K. Rowling or Jacqueline Wilson.

Tell your teacher about what you and your group have been reading.





Watching / Listening

Watch a film where good triumphs over evil. Write a few sentences to explain the following:


- What was the basic plot?

- What happened at the end?










Talk with an older member of your family about a favourite story from their childhood.



Write down a list of the food items that you have chosen and their prices and show it to your teacher.





















Find out which political party is currently in power. Use the Internet to help you find out a few simple facts about their history or beliefs and write these down to show your teacher.

Write a few sentences to explain your strategies and share your work with your teacher.














Take a look at all the plants that you can see in your local environment eg. the park or your garden. Make sketches of a couple of these plants or take photographs and then try to name them.





Family

While you are making your bread, look carefully at what happens when the yeast reacts with the sugar and write down your observations in a few sentences.








With your family, look at a map of your village, town or city. It could be an online map or a paper copy.


Try to locate your street and, if possible, your house. Tell your teacher about the map that you used.

Write a few sentences about a visit you have made in the past or a visit you would like to make in the future. Perhaps you could illustrate your work with clippings from your travel brochure.



Write a sentence to explain what you thought about this tasting experience and show it to your teacher.




Watching / Listening

Listen to some music by a composer or singer associated with the country whose language you are studying.


Write a couple of sentences about what you have listened to, explaining whether or not you enjoyed it and why.






Historians often use the following words:

A Christmas Carol


Write a short review, including a couple of sentences about the time period in which the film is set.



Draw something that you can see in your garden, back yard or local area. It could be a tree, flower, a building or something else.


Make sure that your drawing is drawn to scale, with rendering.





Family

Paint a picture of a family member. Try to make your painting consistent and accurate, with obvious depth and tone.










What is a lever? You could find out by looking on the Internet. Find some examples of levers and write a few sentences to explain how they work.

Write a few sentences to explain what you have learned and show them to your teacher.






With help from an adult, make some vegetable soup for your family to enjoy. You will have to practise your peeling, chopping and grating skills.

Show your recipe to your teacher.















Can you find out what is meant by the word **genre** in music?

What kind of music is being played? Are they playing different styles? Why might that be? Do you recognise any of the tunes?



Bring your instrument into school to show your teacher.




Watching / Listening


Can you work out what it might be? Use the Internet to help you by researching the piece.

Write a few sentences to describe your ideas and share your work with your teacher.










Find out what a saint is by looking in a book or watching a film/tv show or by using the Internet. Choose one saint to focus on and write a paragraph about him or her.

Show your work to your teacher.




Family

Show the poster to your teacher.






Write a few sentences about what is important to Hindus and show these to your teacher.




Watching / Listening

You could use a map or a route-plotting tool on the Internet to help.


Think carefully about safe places to cross any roads.
