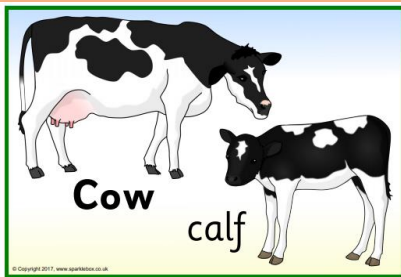

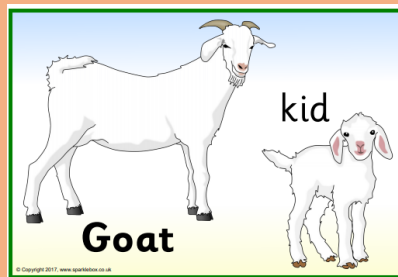
Insects

Most mammals give birth to young. They can be given different names to their parents. Here are some examples.



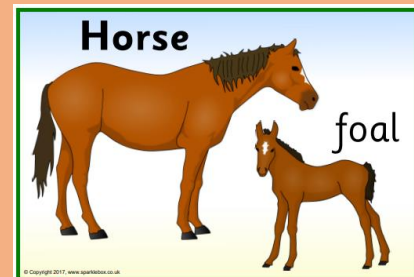

Misconception

Humans are not animals.

Humans are animals. We are mammals. We give birth to young and have hair on our skin.



Key Questions

Do all animals lay eggs?

Lots of different animals lay eggs. Reptiles, fish and birds lay eggs. Mammals e.g. lions, cats and humans do not lay eggs.

Do all insects have wings?

Most insects have two pairs of wings but you can't always see them. There are only 4 insects that don't have wings.

Key Vocabulary

Carnivore	An animal that feeds on other animals e.g. a lion.
Herbivore	An animal that feeds on plants e.g. sheep.
Omnivore	An animal that feeds on both animals and plants e.g. a bear.
