


Enjoy reading a Julia Donaldson book. Be prepared to tell your teacher all about the story.

Visit the local library, become a member and borrow a book. Talk to your teacher about which book you have borrowed.


Tell your teacher all about this book when you have finished reading it.

Share a story with an adult in your family. Who was your favourite character and why?


Tell your teacher.


Watch a television programme that you enjoy. Can you name all the characters?





Tell your teacher all about it.



Watch and sing along with this video, which will help you to count in 2s.



Try to sing the chorus to your teacher.










Find out who is next in line to the throne and tell your teacher.

Pay a visit to someone who is special to you eg. a grandparent, neighbour or good friend, and tell them all about your day.


Talk to your teacher about your visit.



Tell your teacher all about your visit.




Family

Can you think of why this might be and tell your teacher?







Talk to your teacher about what you have learned.










Learn the names of the seven continents of the world and practise reciting them so that you can tell them to your teacher.

Make a simple map of this route together to show your teacher.



Watch and sing along to this song: The Seven Continents Song



Tell your teacher the names of the seven continents.










Share some photographs or memories of a past holiday/ birthday/party/something special with people at home.

Tell your teacher.




Watching / Listening

Tell your teacher what you have found out.















Andy Warhol was a very famous American painter, known for his pop art style. Ask an adult to help you to find a painting by Andy Warhol. This is a useful website to use:


Listen to the account of the children's trip to an art gallery and tell your teacher all about it.









Paint a picture of a family member. Try to apply your paint evenly, accurately and consistently.

Take your painting into school to show your teacher.










Try to find an old **pop-up** book, or ask your teacher if you can take an old one home from school. Take one page apart to find out how it works.

Talk to your teacher about what you have learned.




Family

With an adult, make some fairy buns as a treat for the family. Can you find out where the flour comes from?


Be prepared to tell your teacher.












One of the world's most famous composers was **Mozart**. Look at the following website:

When you get home, use the Internet to help you to listen to the sound tracks of these films. Did you enjoy the music?


Tell your teacher all about it.

Ask a member of your family to teach you a song or to play you a song that they enjoy.


Tell your teacher all about it.

Talk to your teacher about whether or not you enjoyed the song.










Ask family members to help you to think of some religious festivals and celebrations that we take part in.

Tell your teacher all about it.




Family

Tell your teacher what you have found out.














Can you find out five different sports that are part of the Olympics?

Watch a clip of a sporting event from a recent summer Olympics (eg. Rio 2016, London 2012) - these can be found online.


Talk about the event with a member of your family.
