


Take some photographs or ask an adult to write some of these down.



Jackson Pollock was a very famous American painter, known for his style of drip painting. Ask an adult to help you to find a painting by Jackson Pollock.





Draw something that you can see in your garden, back yard or local area. It could be a tree, flower, a building or something else.



Think about church bells, music from shops, music playing on the street, music playing from cars etc.






Watching / Listening

Did you enjoy the piece? Did it make you feel sleepy?








Ask an adult to help you to read the words 'heroes' and 'heroines.' Do you know what these words mean? Who are your heroes and heroines?
