	<p>Ole Kirk Christiansen (1891 - 1958) A Danish carpenter who in 1932 founded the Danish construction company 'The Lego Group'.</p>

Key Questions	
What is the difference between an object and a material?	Objects are things that you can touch or see. A material is what objects are made from.
Which materials are natural?	Natural materials are materials which are found in nature. Chalk, sand, oil, leather, iron, gold, cotton, coal and wood are natural materials.
Which materials are man made?	Man-made materials are materials which have been produced by humans. Concrete, glass, paper, rubber, steel and plastic are man made materials.
What words can I use to describe materials?	Properties describe the material or object. You can use words such as, transparent, opaque, waterproof, stiff, soft and stretchy.

Misconceptions/Key words
<p>Misconception Plastic is not breakable.</p>
<p>Fact Plastic can be broken. Different types of plastics have different properties. Some types of plastics can be broken more easily than others. For example the plastic used to make cling-film wrap breaks more easily than the plastic used to make a plug cover.</p>
