

Catch Up Premium Strategy Statement

The Coronovirus Pandemic has placed children and young people in unprecedented times with significant periods of lost teaching. We must be aware that the impact of lost teaching will be felt for a number of years to come within education.

In a support to address the legacy of lost teaching, the Government has allocated a one-off payment to all schools and academies to ensure that support can be offered to learners in the school environment to move forward and accelerate progress, maximising opportunity to succeed in their academic studies.

This single funding total allocated to each academy will be spent in the most appropriate way for individual learners, cohorts and circumstance to deliver a bespoke package of support relevant to each individual academy.

The impact of the funding available to each academy will be reflected in the sustained academic performance over the coming years. Local Governing Boards will hold Headteachers and Senior Leaders to account for the impact of their strategy.

Good Teaching priorities - strategies identified to maximise good teaching to move learners forward

Priority 1: To raise standards and accelerate progress in Reading as a result of the targeted support for fluency, comprehension and vocabulary through personalised eLearning.

ADP Link – Development Focus 1

Continue to raise the attainment in reading for all groups of children, with a focus on more children achieving the national standard and greater and depth in reading by the end of KS2 through using direct evidence of the text and through vocabulary acquisition. Also closing a gap which occurred during lockdown in Year 2.

Activity: Reading Plus is a web-based program that builds upon the foundational skills of phonics and phonemic awareness to develop reading with metacognition – reading for meaning. It targets vocabulary, fluency and comprehension and is specific to the individual children's needs. All children in KS2 will all access a minimum of two sessions of Reading Plus each week and intervention provided as extra sessions for children who did not access this during lockdown. (Note: During the lockdown period, children were encouraged to complete daily sessions every afternoon)

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Targeted academic support – strategies identified for individual, or cohorts of learners where additional support is required

Priority 2: To ensure children who have Speech and Language delays have access to regular and reliable Speech and Language Therapy in order to improve spoken language and communication.

Activity: 1:1 Speech and Language sessions which are led by qualified SL Therapists through personalised online sessions. Children are carefully selected, after being highlighted as having speech and language delays. Tutors work with children online 1:1 to assess and target their specific needs to progress their language and communications skills.

Priority 3: To raise standards and accelerate progress in mathematics for specific children as a result of narrowing the gaps in learning using the targeted support of online tutors from Third Space Learning.

Activity: Third space learning is a 1:1 maths tuition programme which takes place online. It will be targeted to 15 specific children in KS2 and will focus on addressing their gaps in learning. The programme starts in January 2021 and will continue throughout the summer term.

Priority 4: To raise standards and accelerate progress for specific pupils in Year 5 narrowing gaps in English and maths using targeted support from online tutors.

ADP Link – Development Focus 1

Continue to raise the attainment in reading for all groups of children, with a focus on more children achieving the national standard and greater and depth in reading by the end of KS2 through using direct evidence of the text and through vocabulary acquisition. Also closing a gap which occurred during lockdown in Year 2.

ADP Link - Development Focus 2

Continue to raise the attainment for all groups of children, with a focus on narrowing the gender gap across the academy and closing the gap which occurred during lockdown in Year 2, particularly in writing by the end of KS1 and lower KS2 through using effective feedback.

Activity: Yipiyap online 1:1 tutor programme will provide support to specific year 5 children for one day a week 5 hours a day from 08/03/21 until the end of term. It will target personalised gaps highlighted by the teachers as a result of effective pre-assessment completion of maths units and knowledge of ability in English.
