Our Houses

Croxby Primary operates a very successful house points system as part of our positive ethos.

This system complements our reward systems within the classroom and has been developed to give children an opportunity to demonstrate positive behaviour for learning throughout the day, including playtimes and


lunchtimes.

The Graduate Award Scheme



We strive to ensure that all our children receive an exceptional grounding in basic skills, including reading, writing, spelling, grammar, mathematical understanding and confidence in the expressive arts.

Our knowledge-based Graduate Awards Programme is designed to complement this and appeal to the children's scholarly aspirations.

Children who wish to become Graduates in the available study topics can elect to study at home and in the academy during their own time, taking the Graduate Quiz when they know they are ready. Upon graduation, they will receive a badge, which they can wear on their academy uniform with pride.

Our Support SEND



At Croxby Primary, we value the achievements and abilities of all our pupils and celebrate their successes.

We strive to provide an inclusive education that not

only engages, inspires and motivates pupils, but develops their skills ready for life beyond the academy. Provision for SEND is regarded as a whole academy responsibility and any concern regarding a child should always be discussed with their class teacher in the first instance.

Safeguarding

At Croxby Primary, we view the safeguarding of our children to be of paramount importance and believe that all our children have the right to be safe, happy and learn.

Everyone who works in, volunteers at or visits our academy has a responsibility to make this happen.

We will ensure that:

- the welfare of all of our children remains paramount at all times
- all suspicions and concerns raised regarding safeguarding matters will be taken seriously and our response will be swift and appropriate
- all adults working or volunteering at our academy will be made aware of our academy's safeguarding arrangements and the importance of reporting any concerns to the appropriate people



Early Years Foundation Stage

Here at Croxby Primary, we believe that the children are entitled to the best possible foundation to their education.

We use both adult-led and child-led learning experiences, which allows the children to become confident and competent individuals. We use stimulating indoor and outdoor provision to ensure children make progress in all areas of learning.

It is a very exciting time when starting at the academy. Here at Croxby we offer transition sessions prior to entering the academy to ensure children and their families feel welcomed, happy and secure in their new learning environment.

Academy Life

It is always an exciting and anxious time, in equal measure, when a child starts the academy.

Here at Croxby Primary we recognise that and do all we can to ensure that children (and parents/carers!) feel as welcomed and familiar with their new surroundings as possible.



Curriculum Enrichment

Musical Theatre: All our children take part in musical theatre lessons for approximately 10 weeks each year. A showcase is held at the end of each block.



Music: At Croxby, music plays a vital role in our curriculum. All children in KS2 are taught how to play two musical instruments and to read music. Children are also offered further opportunities to learn other instruments in small groups.

Sport: All children take part in at least two inter class competitions each year. The academy participates in inter school competitions in many sports. Taking part and developing sportsmanship are key to our offer but so is winning.



Within the last few years, the academy has had individual and team success in cross-country, dodgeball, netball, football and athletics.

Academy Meals

We provide an excellent variety of meals for all children and free school meals for Key Stage 1, which are all cooked on our premises daily and served to our children in our academy hall.

We are very fortunate to be able to offer a varied menu consisting of a main hot meal or an academy sandwich, all of which are served with vegetables. This is followed by a choice of pudding, fresh fruit or yoghurt and water is also available.

Free School Meals

If you believe you may be eligible for Free School Meals as you are a low income family or receiving benefits, then please contact our Academy Office for further details. Acceptance for Free School Meals not only provides your family with a benefit to the value of approximately £450 per child per year, but also benefits the academy via the Government's Pupil Premium Grant.

Uniform

At Croxby Primary, the academy uniform is a major part of our ethos and all children are required to wear it. It's important to turn up to our academy feeling that you belong and looking ready to learn. Our uniform does exactly that.
