

ANIMALS



Mammals give birth to their young and they drink their mother's milk.

Mammals have skeletons on the inside of their body and have skin or fur. E.g. humans, cows, monkeys, lions and elephants.



Reptiles lay eggs.

Reptiles have scales, ear holes and dry skin. E.g. snakes, crocodiles, lizards and turtles.



Fish live and lay eggs in the water.

Fish have fins to move and gills to breathe underwater. E.g. sharks, clownfish, stingrays and tuna.




Birds have feathers, wings and a beak.


Birds live on land and water and lay eggs. E.g, owls, woodpeckers, eagles and parrots.



Insects have three body parts; most have two pairs of wings.

Insects have skeletons on the outside of their bodies. E.g. butterflies, ants, crickets and beetles.
