EARLY LIFE

Frank Auerbach was born on April 29, 1931, in Berlin, Germany. He moved to London with his family in 1939 to escape the dangers of World War II. Growing up in a new country, he began to develop a love for art at a young age. His family supported his passion for painting, and he decided to become an artist when he was still a teenager.

STUDYING ART
