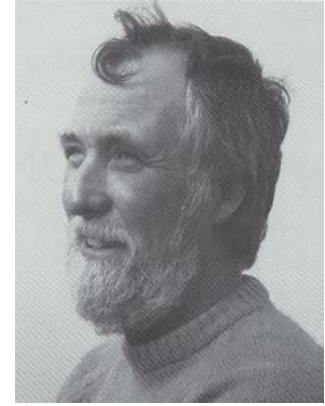




JOHN BRUNSDON
