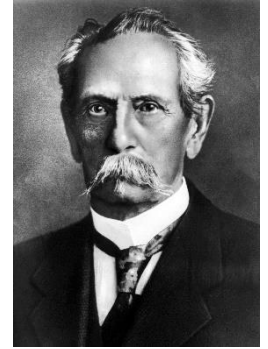




KARL FRIEDRICH BENZ



WHO WAS KARL FRIEDRICH BENZ?

Karl Friedrich Benz was an engineer and inventor who helped create the first car. He was born on 25 November 1844 in Karlsruhe, Germany. His work changed the way people travel and made cars a part of our everyday lives.

WHAT DID HE INVENT?

In 1885, he built the first car with a petrol engine. It had three wheels and was called the Benz Patent-Motorwagen. This invention was the beginning of modern cars.

HOW DID HIS INVENTION WORK?

The Benz Patent-Motorwagen had a small engine powered by petrol. It could move on its own without being pulled by horses. It had a steering handle and could carry two people. Before cars, people travelled by walking, riding horses, or using carriages. His invention made travel faster and easier. It was the start of a new way for people to get around.

WHAT HAPPENED NEXT?

After his success with the first car, more people became interested in building and improving cars. Today, millions of cars are used all over the world because of the ideas he started. Karl Friedrich Benz's invention changed the world. He is remembered as a pioneer who helped create a new way of living with cars.
