



LEVI STRAUSS



EARLY LIFE

Levi Strauss was born on 26 February 1829 in Buttenheim, a small village in Germany. He grew up in a Jewish family with several siblings. His parents worked hard to provide for their family, but life was not always easy. When Levi was a teenager, his family decided to move to the United States in search of better opportunities.

A NEW LIFE IN AMERICA

In 1847, Levi and his family settled in New York City, where two of his older brothers were running a dry goods business. Levi learned a lot about selling fabrics and clothing from them. A few years later, he moved to San Francisco, California, during the Gold Rush. Many people were travelling to California at that time, hoping to find gold and make their fortunes. Levi saw an opportunity to sell supplies to these miners.

THE INVENTION OF JEANS

Levi started his own business selling fabrics and other goods to miners and workers. He soon realised that the miners needed durable clothing that could withstand the tough work they were doing. In 1873, he partnered with a tailor named Jacob Davis to create trousers made from a strong fabric called denim. To make the trousers even stronger, they used metal rivets to reinforce the pockets. These trousers became known as "blue jeans" and were an instant success.

A LASTING LEGACY

Levi Strauss was not only a clever businessman, but he was also kind and generous. He supported local charities and helped people in need. He never married or had children, but his company continued to grow after his death on 26 September 1902 in San Francisco. Today, blue jeans are worn all over the world, and Levi's name is remembered as the creator of one of the most popular pieces of clothing in history.

Did you know that the first pair of blue jeans cost only \$1.50? That is very cheap compared to today's prices!
