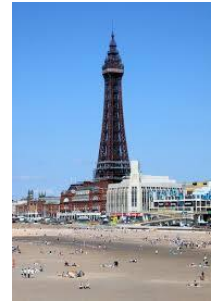




MAXWELL AND TUKE



EARLY LIFE AND BACKGROUND

Francis William Tuke was born on 30 November 1841 in the city of York, England.
