WHAT ARE ENVIRONMENTAL REGIONS?

Environmental regions are large areas of land that share similar weather, plants, animals, and other natural features. These regions can be very different depending on where they are in the world. ENVIRONMENTAL REGIONS OF EUROPE

- **The Mediterranean Region**

The Mediterranean region is found in southern Europe, including countries like Spain, Italy, and Greece. The weather here is warm and sunny most of the year. This region is known for its beautiful beaches, olive trees, and vineyards. Many animals, like lizards and colourful birds, live here. The Mediterranean Sea surrounds this area, making it a popular place for swimming and boating.

- **The Boreal Forests (Taiga)**

In the northern parts of Europe, especially in countries like Sweden, Norway, and Finland, there are vast forests called the **boreal forests** or **taiga**. These forests are home to many types of trees, such as pine and spruce. The weather in these regions is cold, and the winters are long with lots of snow. Animals like reindeer, wolves, and owls live in these forests.

- **The Alpine Region**

The **Alpine region** is found in the mountains of Europe, especially in countries like Switzerland and Austria. The weather here is cold, and the land is covered with snow during the winter. The Alps are famous for skiing and hiking. Animals like ibex, golden eagles, and marmots can be found in these high-altitude areas. The plants that grow here are adapted to the cold and rocky environment.

- **The Grasslands**

In parts of Europe, such as Hungary and Ukraine, there are **grasslands** known as **steppes**. These areas are flat and covered with tall grasses. The weather can be warm and dry, making them perfect for farming. Many animals, like wild horses and birds of prey, live in the grasslands. They are also home to many colourful wildflowers.

- **The Rainforests of South America**

The **Amazon Rainforest** in South America is the largest rainforest in the world. It stretches across countries like Brazil, Peru, and Colombia. The weather here is very hot and humid, with lots of rainfall all year long. The rainforest is home to many animals like jaguars, monkeys, and colourful



parrots. It also has thousands of different types of plants and trees. The rainforest plays an important role in keeping the Earth's climate healthy.

- **The Deserts**

In North America, there are several **deserts**, such as the **Sonoran Desert** and the **Mojave Desert**. Deserts are very dry, with little rainfall. The weather can be extremely hot in the summer. Despite the dryness, there are many plants and animals that are well adapted to the desert, such as cacti, snakes, and camels. Deserts can be found in parts of the United States, Mexico, and Canada.

- **The Grasslands (Prairies)**

In North America, there are large areas of **grasslands**, known as **prairies**. These can be found in parts of the United States and Canada. The weather is warm and often dry, which makes it a good place for grasses to grow. These regions are home to many animals, including bison, prairie dogs, and birds like hawks. Farmers also use the prairies to grow crops like wheat and corn.

- **The Tundra**

In the far northern parts of North America, such as Alaska and Canada, there is an area called the **tundra**. The tundra is a cold, windy place with very little rainfall. During the summer, the weather is a little warmer, but the ground stays frozen for most of the year. There are no trees in the tundra, but there are many small plants like mosses and lichens. Animals such as polar bears, caribou, and snowy owls live in the tundra.

The environment of a region affects how people, animals, and plants live. For example, in the Mediterranean region, people grow olives and grapes because the climate is perfect for these plants. In the deserts, animals and plants have special ways to survive the heat and dryness. In the tundra, animals have thick fur to keep warm, and people live in special houses to protect themselves from the cold.
